## DEAR ALUMNI & FRIENDS OF SETON HILL,

Earlier this year, Bishop Lawrence Brandt invited the administration, faculty and staff of Seton Hill University and Saint Vincent College to join him at a forum where our Catholic identity and mission were the topics of the day. There, our keynote speaker, the Very Reverend David M. O'Connell, C.M., president of Catholic University, concluded in his opening address, "At the end of the day, it is not enough simply to presume on our Catholic identity and mission. We have to make it happen."

### Mission and Identity

In the discussion which followed, Seton Hill faculty members spoke passionately of how they "make it happen" on this campus. In their coursework, their research, and in their everyday commitments as academics who teach and learn in a Catholic intellectual setting, our faculty members described ways they make the Catholic identity and mission come alive at Seton Hill today.

Sister Victoria Marie Gribshaw, associate professor of family and consumer sciences, spoke of the urgency we currently feel in educating future leaders about Catholic Social Teaching, and of foundational courses designed to introduce today's students to the critical principles of Catholic Social Thought. Others noted the curriculum development workshops presented for Seton Hill faculty by Dr. Barbara Wall, special assistant to the president for mission effectiveness at Villanova University. These activities give evidence of the lively commitment of the faculty to the Catholic intellectual tradition on Seton Hill's campus. Their work is supported by the creativity of our Campus Ministry team as they engage with students and by the opportunities offered here for prayer and participation in the sacraments.

We intend in the coming year to continue efforts to keep our Catholic mission evident in all we do, and I am delighted to announce in this respect, that effective this past July, I named Sister Lois Sculco as vice president for Mission and Student Life. Sister Lois has led our Mission Effectiveness Team successfully for years. Now as an outcome of our intention to integrate our mission into all that we teach and do, and to make us mindful as we plan, this important responsibility is reflected in the title of a senior administrator at Seton Hill.



## Academics

So too are the enhanced responsibilities in the area of academics of Dr. Mary Ann Gawelek, formerly vice president and dean of the faculty who has been named provost and dean of the faculty. As provost and dean, Dr. Gawelek continues her duties as chief academic officer and leader of the faculty but additionally assumes responsibility for all assessment and accreditation activities, both institutional and disciplinary. As assessment and accreditation grow more prominent, and universities are asked to measure and demonstrate the effects of their educational endeavors, responsibilities in this area become increasingly critical aspects of our work. Provost Gawelek will provide important leadership in these institutional efforts.

This past year brought evidence of movement forward in a number of curricular areas at Seton Hill.

The Farrell Family Foundation of Pittsburgh has provided a leadership gift to Seton Hill to establish The Farrell Innovation in Business Fund. The Fund will support the creation of The Farrell Chair for Innovation in Business and the development of The Farrell Business Programs. This gift reinforces Seton Hill's ability to recruit and to graduate students who have entrepreneurial mindsets and who possess the liberal arts skills and qualities employers tell us they are looking for, including flexibility, leadership, problem-solving, and communication. We are also pleased to announce that Dr. Lloyd G. Gibson will serve as the newly appointed chair and director of the University's MBA program.

A grant from the United States Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration will support a new youth development program at Seton Hill's Center for Family Therapy in downtown Greensburg. The cognitive-behavioral therapy program assesses drug and alcohol use by local young people and studies the attitudes of youth toward such abuse. Prevention is the key to this program because it reaches children before their problems become insurmountable. This program will support the efforts of our faculty and graduate students who continue to make contributions in the area of health in our community.

In August we began construction for our University Center for the Performing Arts in downtown Greensburg. This new facility will provide our faculty with the kind of specifically designed space needed to support Seton Hill's dynamic theatre and music programs and help us attract greater numbers of students into these academic areas. The University Center project, developed by Seton Hill

and its partners, the City of Greensburg, the County of Westmoreland, the Redevelopment Authority of the County of Westmoreland, the Westmoreland Trust and the Greensburg Salem School District, is already helping to create a new era for Greensburg. Because it is led by community partnerships, our project continues to garner regional and national attention. Indeed, Seton Hill's project is often cited by government and community leaders as a model of the way universities can expand their impact by getting involved in the civic and economic life of their communities.

Seton Hill hosts students here to soak up America

The Allegheny and District Pipe Band recently entered an affiliation agreement with Seton Hill. As a result, the band will officially be known as the Seton Hill University Pipe Band. The bagpipers and drummers will become part of Seton Hill traditions such as commencement, honors convocation, alumni weekend, and homecoming. We view this affiliation as a first step toward the development of a piping and Scottish drumming program at the undergraduate level and for the community.

## International

Twenty-three students from Beijing Union University (BUU), Seton Hill's sister-school in Beijing, China, spent two weeks at Seton Hill this summer studying English and United States culture and visiting Westmoreland county and Pittsburgh attractions. The BUU students were accompanied by two Beijing Union directors, Ms. Wang Tianhong, director of Language Training, International School, and Mr. Wang Zijun, senior officer of Students'

Affairs. We formalized our sister-school relationship with BUU in 2006 and continue to work together to develop joint educational programs, including Seton Hill University degree programs that will be taught on Beijing Union's campus, joint research projects, and student and professor exchange programs.

## Outreach

Concern for others remains an important part of the Seton Hill learning experience, best exemplified by the fact that three separate groups of Seton Hill students, faculty and staff used their spring "break" to assist their neighbors, near and far. Dr. Susan Cooley, director of Seton Hill's Marriage and Family Therapy (MFT) graduate program, took six MFT students to New Orleans to work with

Renewing Hope In New Orleans. The group worked on homes damaged by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, and had the opportunity to assist homeowners living in FEMA trailers.

Twenty students and three Seton Hill staff members volunteered for Campus Ministry's annual Habitat for Humanity Spring Break Trip, coordinated by Cindy Boland,

director of Campus Ministry. The Seton Hill group worked on five different homes in Birmingham, Alabama, doing everything from painting to hauling drywall to helping to install roofs.

Our Education Club, accompanied by their faculty adviser, Dr. Joann Migyanka, headed to rural eastern Kentucky to participate in the Christian Appalachian Project's WorkFest 2007. The Seton Hill team replaced siding, repaired roofs and provided other household repairs in Owsley and Clay Counties in Kentucky.

## Athletics

Seton Hill's athletic programs remain vibrant and exciting examples of the Division II philosophy of life in the balance: academics; athletics; and service. The equestrian team continues to attract young students with competitive show experience. Earlier this year one of our riders qualified to represent the University at the Eastern States Exposition, the national championship held in Massachusetts. Our baseball team, led by coach Marc Marizzaldi, had another solid performance as well, and celebrated when computer science graduate, Rick Austin, became the first Griffin baseball player to be drafted in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies in June. Soccer coach Dan McCarty reports that Daryl Ferguson, a 2007 Seton Hill graduate, recently returned from Barbados where he trained with the Olympic National Men's (Under 23) Soccer Team to participate in qualifying rounds for the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. Daryl also played for the Delaware Dynasty, the premier soccer development league and is being invited by professional teams for individual and team tryouts. Football coach Chris Snyder greeted 95 players for camp this past August, and the team just completed its third season at Offutt Field in Greensburg. Seton Hill cheerleaders continue to amaze with their gymnastic and acrobatic skills. Our squad lifts our spirits—and each other. Seton Hill's new pep band, the first in University





history, and under the direction of Dr. Ted DiSanti, associate professor of music, began playing at Seton Hill sporting events and celebrations this fall. We expect the lively new "Griffin Band" to have more than 50 members by the end of its first season.

### Accolades

This past summer, Israel's Holocaust Remembrance Authority, Yad Vashem, honored Sr. Gemma Del Duca, SC, of Seton Hill's National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education (NCCHE) with the Excellence in Holocaust Education Award. Sr. Gemma's honor represented the first time a non-Israeli was recognized in this award category. It was a momentous occasion for our twenty year-old Center and I was delighted to travel to Israel with Sr. Lois Sculco and Wilda Kaylor, associate director for the NCCHE, for the presentation. Washington DC Archbishop Donald W. Wuerl said about the Center and Sr. Gemma, "They have become in themselves symbols of the effort to help others, and in a special way Catholics, to recognize the unique character of the Holocaust and how it helps define Jewish-Catholic relations." Sr. Gemma's tireless labors continue to remind us that the work of understanding, reconciliation and peace, is never done.

Earlier in the year our women's business center, E-Magnify, announced new and expanded programming as a result of being designated a Women's Business Center (WBC) by the U.S. Small Business Administration. Led by Director Jayne Huston, E-Magnify joins forces with the 99 other WBCs that exist nationwide to assist women in starting, growing, and expanding their businesses.

The Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) named Seton Hill University's publication, "Coming Attractions: The Seton Hill University Center for the Performing Arts," the winner of a gold medal in its District II Accolades Awards Program. "Coming Attractions" took the gold in the Fundraising Publications/Case Statements category. A group of alumni and Seton Hill staff gathered in New York City's Rockefeller Center for the award presentation. Recognition by CASE places the University, and one of its publications, in the national spotlight.





The Seton Hill University Choir, directed by Associate Professor of Music Marvin Huls, performed at the Pennsylvania Music Educator's Association State Conference earlier this year. Seton Hill's choir was one of only two collegiate choral groups in the state selected to perform, out of more than 200 who applied.

Seton Hill earned the number 12 spot among the "Best Baccalaureate Colleges in the North Region" in the 2008 edition of "America's Best Colleges" published by U.S. News and World Report. The exclusive rankings appeared in the magazine's August 2007 edition.

## Enrollment & Finances


We continue to achieve our enrollment goals. This year's freshman class of 328 students brings our total enrollment to more than 2,000. The creation of four full-tuition scholarships for freshmen who are outstanding scholars has brought tremendous interest from prospective students. The four recipients of these more than \$100,000 scholarships, known as Seton Scholars, began their careers as Setonians this fall. The help of alumni, particularly those who are part of our Alumni Ambassador network, makes an important difference in our enrollment efforts. We value the vote of confidence you cast when you recommend a student to Seton Hill and when you send a Seton Scholar this way.

I can report with confidence that for the ninth consecutive year we have a surplus in our budget and have achieved a 4.8 percent operating margin. In addition, as the result of the generous support of alumni and friends, Seton Hill's endowment fund now totals more than \$14.6 million.

We had another notable year in fund raising in 2006-2007 with more than \$5 million achieved in private gifts and grants for the Annual Fund and capital projects, compared to \$3.9 million in 2005-2006—representing a 31 percent increase in such commitments. We are well on our way to meeting the requirements of The Richard King Mellon Foundation Challenge for the Annual Fund as well. Alumni and friends have responded to our calls for new, increased and multi-year gifts and pledges with commitments totaling more than \$425,000 toward the \$500,000 challenge that expires in December. As a result of your generosity the capital and endowment campaign, begun so hopefully nine years ago, has now reached the grand total of more than \$66 million!

When I meet with alumni and friends across the country I am touched by the genuine love for Seton Hill that inspires them to remain involved in the life of this special place. During a recent trip to San Diego, alumni from class years as early as 1933 and as recent as 2007 delighted prospective students and their families with shared Seton Hill experiences. I thank you for your continuing support of Seton Hill University. The words of our Seton Hill motto come to mind: Hazard Yet Forward.

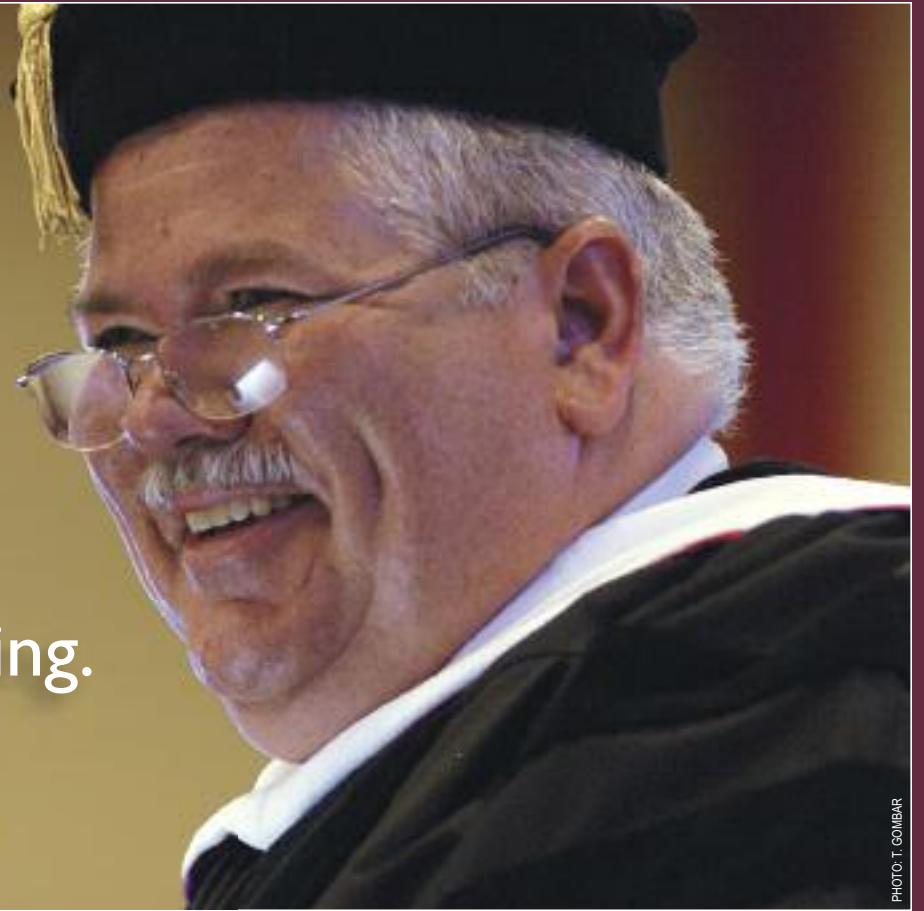

# Order the Special.

“**W**hat a day! A glorious day. A perfect day for a graduation. It’s a day of pomp and ritual and silly hats. What more can you ask for on a spring Saturday in Greensburg?”

Here’s the truth. I’ve been nervous about giving this speech since I first got the invitation from Dr. Boyle. Full of trepidation, to put it mildly. Maybe because I think I haven’t been to many commencements since my own graduation from high school. I graduated from college but did it in December and didn’t ever go to a ceremony like this. And I want to be worthy of this event.

But I try not to turn down unexpected invitations. You probably heard that Kurt Vonnegut died last month. Well, I often think of something that he wrote in his book called *Cat’s Cradle*. (Vonnegut was one of my heroes, and few books are as easy and fun and terrifying as *Cat’s Cradle*. And if you don’t

know it, get a copy.) It includes a religion that Vonnegut invented, or a character in the book invented, called Bokononism. Bokonon is the character. And one of the tenets of this religion is that “Peculiar travel suggestions are dancing lessons from God.”

I’ve re-interpreted that to mean “travel” in any sense, even just 35 miles from Pittsburgh to Greensburg. I now rephrase it as “Unexpected invitations are dancing lessons from God.” That’s really why I’m here.

And, of course, soon after I said yes to President Boyle, it was announced that that other school nearby would have the Presi-

dent of the United States there as its commencement speaker. No pressure there. No matter what you may think of the guy... that's calling in the big guns. The President of the United States. I just make programs for public television...

But here we are. It's a landmark day in so many people's lives. Congratulations to all you students who have done it: gotten your degree. You will soon have what the Wizard of Oz told the Scarecrow was more important than a brain: a diploma. Congratulations also to all you connected people who've helped make all this possible: families, professors, and teachers, and role models. Friends. I'm guessing most of you who aren't wearing a silly hat know at least one person who is.

These are people here who today are marking the completion of this phase of their education.

But it's just one phase. I can see that most of you are annoyingly young. But what is youth if it's not the need and the will to learn? And so I'll take the moment to offer some bits of advice.

Take advantage of your youth. Do lots of stuff. Goof off. I know that I'm not that different than the guy who graduated from college 32 years ago. And I'm warning you: just a moment from now, you will turn around, and it will be 32 years since your graduation. And you want to fill those years with exciting and worthwhile experiences. And keep your education going, filling in the gaps. Oh, you've learned a lot here at Seton Hill, but I'm guessing there are some details you've missed.

Gaps in education make me think of a story that my cameraman Bob Lubomski told me. (Bob happens to be here today, but I didn't plan that.) Bob has a million stories. One of my favorites is about a trip after he got out of the Army. He and a buddy decided to spend some time out west, driving to Vegas and Palm Springs and such, celebrating. They had some wild times I'm sure as they headed toward the Pacific, and one night after some big time partying, they tried to follow a suggested short cut, an "unexpected travel suggestion." And they ended up lost, somewhere in the desert, and pulled over to the side of the road and decided to sleep for a while in the car. When they woke up the next morning, Bob's buddy says, "Wow. Where are we? Which way do we go?" And Bob says, "Well, I don't know where we are, but the sun's over there, so that's north, and we head north till we find a left turn and that'll point us toward the Pacific."

And the buddy says, "How do you know all that?"

And Bob says, "Well, you know, the sun rises in the East and sets in the West."

And the buddy says, "Every day?"

It was just one of those gaps, one of those days that guy was absent from grade school.

But at least he was still asking the questions and learning. There's tons that we all don't know — even if we have a degree.

Now I don't want to waste your time with a lot of advice. I think the best advice in life is simply two words: question

everything. Be skeptical. Don't blindly accept what anyone tells you. Reconsider. Think. How can you know what is the truth? But you've been in school for many years now. You know that questioning everything is crucial. It's what education is all about. Educated people don't agree with everything they hear on TV. They don't agree with everything they read. They question. Everything.

I think some of my nervousness today comes from questioning all this. How can I be of help or interest to you students? Should I have sat down as soon as I said "Congratulations?" Why exactly did you invite me to do this?

Well, the truth is, I have an interesting job. And when I think about my job, advice and graduation, I think of my dad. I was very lucky. And I wish you luck. I was lucky because when I graduated from college, 32 years ago, my dad told me to wait for the right job. And he helped pay my bills till I found one that I really wanted. I don't want to put a damper on the day, but I remember the 6 months after I graduated as the worst days of my life, trying to find my first real job. I wanted to work in TV. No matter what you're interested in, you may be in for some of the same. Good luck. Work at it. Wait as long as you can. Wait for a job you want, doing at least some of the things you've learned to love while you've been in school. Or at least a step toward things you love. No one below the age of 30 wants to hear that you may have to pay some dues before you get to do exactly what you want to do, but it often works out that way.

But I wish for you a job as good as the one I now have, a job that comes with a built-in educational component. My job forces me to learn new things constantly. It's a job that changes all the time, and a job that lets me meet and

talk with new people in ever changing environments: from Kennywood to coal mines, hot dog shops to cemeteries. I know there are people who hate their jobs and who hate getting up in the morning, but not me, and not most of the people I work with. I wish you the luck and the perseverance to find your way to such a situation.

Now, I remember another bit of advice my dad gave me: In a restaurant, especially at lunch, always order the special. Now this may seem like frivolous advice at a graduation, but I think it's really the kind of common sense reminder that sometimes gets forgotten in the course of formal education. Food is important and powerful. It's often the start of good conversation, pleasant times and strong friendships. Dr. Samuel Johnson, the great 18th century English writer, once wrote that a person who doesn't pay attention to what he eats probably won't pay attention to anything else either. Order the special.

While I was in high school, one of my teachers, Dr. William Switala, gave our class a bit of practical advice that I've remembered ever since. It was this: Always be reading a book. His point was that reading was one of the things that elevated us humans above the other animals. He didn't mean that you had to be constantly reading, but rather that you should always be in the middle of at least one book, maybe two or three. And when you finish one book, start another one right away. I've done that ever since. And I encourage you to do the same. Don't watch so much TV. Turn off the computer every now and then. But always be reading a book.

I'll tell you: it helps to read the newspaper every day too. On-line if you're so inclined, but the actual paper is still an amazing bargain. Full of information and opinions and stuff you might need to know. I'm often looking for articles that include a bit of local history because many of my programs deal with life and history in western Pennsylvania.

And my next bit of advice has to do with the Pittsburgh area, western Pennsylvania and young people like most of you. My advice: Get the hell out of here. Even if it's just for a month or

two. Get out of this world for a while, especially if you've been here for years. Go on a trip. If you haven't ever really traveled anywhere, go now. Leave this country. Check out Afghanistan! *[Note: Seton Hill University honored Dr. Thomas Goultierre, one of the country's foremost experts on Afghanistan, with an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree during the commencement exercises for which Sebak served as speaker.]*

See what people think of America and Americans from a distance. If you have already been places, go somewhere new, some place you've never been. Go to Paris. Hong Kong. Australia. Prague. Go to Buffalo if you've never been there. Go somewhere. See everything. Spend some time in a coastal city. Global warming may change all of them sooner than we think. As far as I'm concerned, Pittsburgh is a pretty wonderful city, for lots of reasons, but there are other wonderful places elsewhere too. You can come back. Lots of people do. Me included. Remember: "Peculiar travel plans are dancing lessons from God." Be sensitive to those opportunities.

I love Pittsburgh, but I loved living in South Carolina for 11 years too, and I went to school in North Carolina, and I lived in France for a year when I was 20. I wouldn't give up those experiences for anything. The truth is though, getting out and about gets harder as you get older and you start accumulating baggage. For most of you, now is sublime. Go. You may eventually come back and love this part of the world for a whole new set of reasons, but it's good to see things and gather some experiences while you can. Take a hike.

And while you're out and about, talk to people. I took a course in journalism once, and my teacher, Bill Emerson, at the University of South Carolina, had written an essay about "The Importance of Small Talk." You know, just shooting the breeze. Telling jokes. Interacting with people. Playing around with folks. The way you treat people every day — the cashier at the grocery store, waiters and waitresses, the dry cleaner, the people at the coffee shop, guys at the gas station — that's not trivial. All that's very important because it's an everyday manifestation of your personality, and that may be your most important

work: creating your personality. Your small talk reveals a lot about how you value and appreciate your fellow human beings. Of course, your family and good friends are very important, but don't discount how you treat the rest of the world. Make good small talk.

And remember you're not alone. Appreciate the people who have helped you and who help make you the person you are.

Now because I've worked for a while in public television in Pittsburgh, of course I knew Mister Rogers. He gave a lot of commencement speeches, and he had this good trick, this gimmick, where he'd ask people to pause for a minute and think about the people who helped you get here. People he called, "those who nourish you at the deepest part of your being ... anyone who has ever loved you and wanted what was best for you in life." He'd say, "Some of those people may be here today. Some may be far away, some may even be in Heaven, but if they've encouraged you to come closer to what you know to be essential about life, I'd like you to have a silent minute to think of them." Well, I'm not going to give you Fred's silent minute, because you're probably doing it already. You can do it anytime. Think about parents and family and the people who've helped you get to this moment in your life. People who helped financially or spiritually or intellectually. Everybody can do this, and we don't do it enough.

You know, I mentioned my dad earlier, and I should have mentioned my mom. And all they taught me. I mentioned a couple of teachers. There were many. The people I traveled with. Kurt Vonnegut, my cameraman Bob, even Mister Rogers himself. Think of the people who have helped you get this far, and, as Fred would say, "Imagine how grateful they must be that at this extra special moment in your life, you're remembering them with such thanksgiving."

Before we go, let me recap. Remember all the people who have helped you. Make good small talk. Travel. Get away for a while. Always be reading a book. Order the special. Try to find a job that makes you happy and ready to get up every

morning. And, most importantly: question everything, including everything I've told you today. Your education is not over. And tomorrow the sun will rise in the east and set in the west...

How odd it is to hear myself saying some of these things. But how wonderful to have this opportunity. Thank you. And congratulations again. You're educated, off to seek your fortune. The best of luck. Find a future where you continue your education. Where you learn the proverbial something new every day.

And when your buddy looks at you and says "Every day?"

You can say "Every day."

My time is up. Your time is just beginning. Congratulations."

# Q&A with MBA Program Director Dr. Lloyd G. Gibson

**Q:** What is the educational marketplace like for students interested in business?

**Dr. Gibson:**

The marketplace in which Seton Hill competes for business students is competitive. Several notable programs, grounded in the liberal arts and with distinct focus areas, are located within a 35-mile radius of the University. Some of the programs take a classic approach to business education while others are designed for a particular market niche aligned with the institution's mission or signature programs.

**Q:** Why is Seton Hill's approach to entrepreneurship different?

**Dr. Gibson:**

**Dr. Gibson:**


My first priority will be to work with Mike Farrell, our Advisory

Board, and faculty to keep the format and delivery of all of our programs dynamic.

I look forward to the creation of the Farrell Executive Scholar program as well. These executives share real, first-person expertise in their respective fields and advance our commitment to creating a talented workforce for Southwestern Pennsylvania and the world. Having recently completed my doctoral degree while working full time, I want them to know that I am able to empathize with the multiple demands facing them each day. # National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education Inspires Study of Genocide in the Cause of Peace

## Sr. Gemma Del Duca First Non-Israeli to Receive Excellence in the Field of Holocaust Education Honor from Israel's Holocaust Remembrance Authority

**S**r. Gemma Del Duca, SC, PhD, who has dedicated her life to the cause of Holocaust education, became the first non-Israeli to be honored by Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Remembrance Authority, with the Excellence in Holocaust Education Award. Sr. Gemma, who co-founded (with Sr. Noël Kernan, SC, PhD) Seton Hill University's National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education (NCCHE), serves as the Center's director in Israel, where she coordinates the Center's Catholic Institute for Holocaust Studies and administers the Isaac Jacob Institute for Religious Law.

Sr. Gemma accepted the award on Sunday, July 1, 2007, during a special presentation held at Yad Vashem in Jerusalem.


"The prize I receive is a shared one," said Sr. Gemma. "It belongs to the Sisters of Charity who have supported me during difficult and easy times, and to one Sister especially, Mary Noël Kernan, our co-director emerita; to our National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education at Seton Hill University, especially to Sister Lois Sculco and Wilda Kaylor; and to our creative, forward-looking President JoAnne Boyle and all associated with us




in this work of Holocaust education. And, yes, it belongs to you teachers in Israel... As educators we learned here at Yad Vashem to cross borders whether of nationality, religion, or generation. And into this kind of intellectual environment created by the study of the Shoah [the Holocaust], we have invited our students, gently, carefully, and with sensitivity, to cross borders of nationality, religion, and generation. The Yad Vashem experience continues to challenge us as educators to commit ourselves, as so many of the survivors have, to the work of 'tikkun olam,' the mending of our world."

"It is a great pleasure to salute Sister Gemma Del Duca, SC of the National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education as she receives the Yad Vashem Excellence in Holocaust Education Award," said Washington DC Archbishop Donald W. Wuerl, who has served on the Center's Advisory Board. "The Center and Sister Gemma Del Duca do more than educate. They have become in themselves symbols of the effort to help others, and in a special way Catholics, to recognize the unique character of the Holocaust and how it helps define Jewish-Catholic relations."

"I congratulate Sister Gemma of the National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education for receiving this prestigious award that honors teaching excellence in a subject that is extremely difficult, yet so important, to pass on to future generations," said Greensburg, Pennsylvania Bishop Lawrence E. Brandt. "The efforts of Sister Gemma and the Center have enabled educators and students from Catholic schools in the diocese to participate in programs at Seton Hill and at concentration camps in Europe. A meaningful testimonial to the importance of their work came from one teacher who, after visiting the death camps, said the experience gave her the compassion and desire to pass on not only the facts and stories of the Holocaust, but a lesson in the necessity for respecting the sacredness of all human life at whatever stage from conception to natural death."

"Gemma has been my role model and hero," said Dr. Edie B. Naveh, Director, Holocaust Center of the United Jewish Federation of Pittsburgh, "for teaching the Holocaust, and for building relations with the Christian community and all religious groups."

## SHU Professor Travels to Israel to Research Peacemaking

Sociology Professor and Director of New Program in Genocide and Holocaust Studies Spends Two Months in Israel Interviewing Israeli and Palestinian Peace Activists

**D**r. James Paharik, associate professor of sociology, spent two months in the spring of 2007 traveling in Israel and the West Bank interviewing individuals involved in what he refers to as “peacemaking activities.” Dr. Paharik uses this term to encompass everything from the work done by Sr. Monika Dullmann, SJA, who directs the only hospice in Jerusalem that serves Jews, Christians and Muslims together, to the founding of the Arik Institute for Reconciliation, Tolerance and Peace, an organization created for bereaved Israeli and Palestinian families by an Israeli businessman after his son was killed by Hamas.

During his time in Israel, Dr. Paharik recorded interviews with 25 Israelis and Palestinians - Christian, Jewish, and Muslim - involved in peace activities. He asked them about their motivations, the challenges they’ve experienced, and their visions for the future. Dr. Paharik also kept an online journal, *The Long Journey*, an engaging read that chronicles his travels in Israel while providing historical context for his experiences and the stories relayed by his interviewees.

Dr. Paharik became interested in Israeli/Palestinian grassroots

conflict resolution activities while attending the National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education’s (NCCHE) Catholic Institute for Holocaust Studies at the Yad Vashem International School of Holocaust Studies in Jerusalem during the summer of 2005.

“As immersed as I was in the study of the Holocaust, and how, as a professor, to teach the Holocaust, I couldn’t help looking around and wondering about the current conflict,” Paharik says. “The fact that there is so much hostility in what is the holiest place on earth, for so many of us, is very disturbing. I started looking around for someone I could learn from about attempts at conflict resolution.”

Paharik’s interest in the topic led him to Father Johannes Oravec, OSB, at the Benedictine Abbey at the Basilica of the Dormition of Mary on Mt. Zion in Jerusalem. The monastery there has served as a neutral place for meetings and political negotiations between Israelis and Palestinians since 1948. In 2005, Father Oravec was the director of the then newly-founded Beit Benedict Peace Academy, a means of extending and institutionalizing the programs and initiatives of the Bene-

dictines on behalf of peace. Dr. Paharik became such a strong believer in the interfaith academy that he and his wife, Helene Paharik, co-founded the Beit Benedict Foundation to promote support for the academy in the U.S. (The Pahariks received the Islamic Center of Pittsburgh’s Humanitarian Award in 2006 in recognition of their work with the Beit Benedict Foundation.)

Father Oravec and the Dormition Abbey helped to facilitate Paharik’s 2007 research, as did many people in the U.S., Israel and Palestine, including Zoughbi Zoughbi, the director of Wi’am (Palestinian Conflict Resolution Center), in Bethlehem, West Bank; and Dr. Gershon Baskin, co-director of the Israel-Palestine Center for Research and Information – the only joint Palestinian-Israeli public policy think-tank in the world.


Dr. Paharik, a Seton Hill professor for 25 years, has until the past few years concentrated on research closer to home, including projects for the Mental Health Association in Westmoreland County and the Westmoreland Coalition on Housing. He credits the NCCHE for sparking his interest in the research, and teaching, of the Holocaust.

Dr. Paharik’s current research is the foundation for an academic journal article on approaches to interfaith dialogue that are

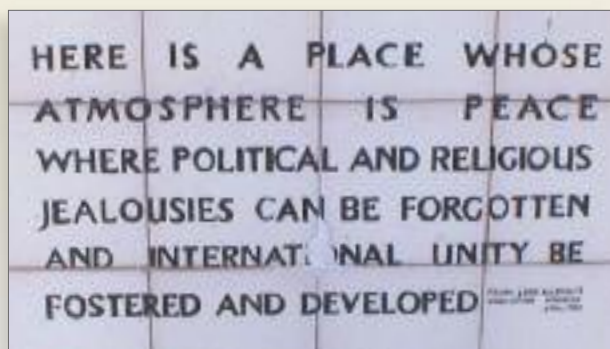
used by organizations in Jerusalem, tentatively titled “Breaking the Barriers: The Theory and Practice of Interreligious Encounters.” His interview of 84-year-old Ester Golan, a survivor of the Holocaust who is now a peace activist in Jerusalem (pictured, left, with Dr. Paharik), is described in the article “Ester Golan: A Life of Tragedy and Forgiveness,” published in the Spring/Summer 2007 issue of the NCCHE’s newsletter. He also wrote a research report for the Dormition Abbey, based on information

he gathered during his research on peace activities, titled “Envisioning the Future of Beit Benedict Peace Academy: Obstacles, Opportunities, Recommendations.” *The Long Journey* has already been accepted for publication by the Liturgical Press.

“Prior to becoming involved with the Center, my research centered on the local community,” Paharik

says. “Now, after visiting Israel, and having the opportunity to study at Yad Vashem, the preeminent center for Holocaust research ... I still feel I do community-based research, it’s just that my community has grown.”

## Marriage and Family Therapy Director Takes Student Therapists to New Orleans to Learn and Rebuild

**Dr. Susan Cooley**, director of Seton Hill's Marriage and Family Therapy (MFT) graduate program, took six MFT students to New Orleans to work with Renewing Hope In New Orleans (RHINO) from March 3–10, 2007. While there, the group gutted homes damaged by hurricanes Katrina and Rita, and had the opportunity to meet several of the homeowners, living at the time in FEMA trailers. Seton Hill's Graduate Advisory Council named the participating students 2007's Outstanding Graduate Students for their work in New Orleans, and for participating in a longitudinal study of the impact of this humanitarian work on both their personal and professional development as marriage and family therapists.

"The students worked within a community that is severely, chronically, traumatized," says Dr. Cooley. "They learned the impact of disaster on a community at large, and on particular individuals. [The students] had to find ways to balance exposure to great tragedy with activities that nourished them, so that they could be emotionally and physically prepared to return to their work the next day... This intense laboratory served as the beginning of a 3 – 5 year study, and also provided the students with skills they can use daily in providing therapy to couples, individuals and families."

## SHU Theatre Professor's Voice Carries

Associate professor of theatre **Denise Pullen** has been providing professional voice-over services for the past 12 years, "selling everything from birthing rooms to nuclear power plants." She also lends her voice to industrial training videos, phone answering systems (including Seton Hill's), and marketing and promotional videos. According to Pullen, she's "sneezed, wheezed, spoke and sang in dialects including Hungarian and Hispanic, and created voices for all kinds of characters and critters." Pittsburgh area residents have heard her voice on Foodland commercials, and as an announcer for the Pittsburgh Symphony Pops. During the summer of 2007, her clients included Rite-Aid, Akron Art Museum, and Aon Consulting. Pullen continues to train toward certification in Fitzmaurice Voicework, a comprehensive approach to voice training that can include, as needed, work on breathing, resonance, speech, dialects, impromptu speaking, text, singing, and voice with movement. Pullen shares her talents and experience with her Seton Hill students in Voice and Speech and Oral Interpretation classes, and has been pleased to discover that many of them have been offered professional voice-over work after completing her courses.

## Humanities Chair Promotes "Total Immersion" for Learning Languages

**Dr. John Spurlock**, chair of the Humanities Division at Seton Hill, has been instrumental in developing "total immersion" courses for students wishing to learn, or hone their skills in, a foreign language. Seton Hill currently offers two study abroad courses at foreign language institutes, a J-Term course in Mexico at the Universidad Internacional (UI) for the study of Spanish, and an M-Term course at the Institut d'Enseignement de la Langue Francaise sur la Cote d'Azur (ELFCA) in Hyeres, France, for the study of French. A third course will be offered during the 2008 M-Term at Beijing Union University, for students interested in learning Chinese.

Students at language institutes are tested upon arrival and placed into courses that match their command of the language. They are then placed in small classes at the institute; at UI, for instance, classes are limited to no more than six students per instructor. In addition to intensive language study, students often study the host country's culture as well.

"In an immersion program," says Dr. Spurlock, "students use all four language skills in a given day—listening, speaking, reading, and writing. This means that in three weeks at UI students will hear and speak more Spanish in the classroom than during two full semesters of conventional language classes at Seton Hill. In addition, many institutes house students with local families, where the language being learned is the predominant (sometimes only), language spoken."

## Director of Seton Hill's Center for Family Therapy and SHU Sociology Professor Partnering in Research on Workplace Dynamics

**Dr. Susan Eichenberger**, assistant professor of sociology, and **Dr. Rebecca Harvey**, director of Seton Hill's Center for Family Therapy, are pursuing a shared research interest in how differences in gender, race, and sexual identity affect working relationships. Drs. Harvey and Eichenberger utilize an interdisciplinary perspective, blending both sociological and psychological principles in their research and in their presentations on the topic to faculty, students, and social service agencies. They hope to use what they've learned, according to Dr. Harvey, to "help a variety of people in a variety of settings examine their work and improve their working relationships." They will begin a joint research project in 2008 on college students' attitudes toward racism and homophobia.

## Business Professor Teams Up with Career-Works and E-Magnify to Develop and Present National Workshops on Connecting Higher Ed. to the Workplace

**Rebecca Campbell**, director of Seton Hill's Career Works, and **Dr. Doina Vlad**, assistant professor of business, presented the workshop "Entrepreneurial Skills Development: Connecting Higher Education and the Workplace" at The Entrepreneurial Retreat for Professors, a workshop opportunity at Juniata College in Huntingdon, Pennsylvania in June 2007. This retreat attracted faculty members from all academic disciplines interested in integrating entrepreneurship into their courses. The workshop has also been presented at two national entrepreneurial education conferences - the United States Association for Small Business and Entrepreneurship's "The Wide World of Entrepreneurship" January 2007 conference, and the Consortium for Entrepreneurship Education's December 2006 conference - by Campbell, Vlad, and **Jayne Huston**, director of Seton Hill's E-Magnify women's business center. "Entrepreneurial Skills Development: Connecting Higher Education and the Workplace" highlights the Seton Hill University entrepreneurial skills component of the liberal arts core curriculum, activities for a multi-phased student development process, and a model for small business internship training.

## Psychology Professor Works with SHU Alumna and Graduate Student to Develop New Instrument for Measuring Drug-Related Behaviors and Attitudes in Adolescents

**Dr. Alvaro Barriga**, associate professor of psychology, and colleagues are happy to announce the upcoming release of the "How I Think about Drugs and Alcohol" (HIT-D&A) questionnaire through Research Press of Chicago. The HIT-D&A is a new measure of drug-related behaviors and attitudes, designed specifically for use with adolescents. Barriga states that "the adolescent years are important in the formation of lifelong health habits that can too often include maladaptive drug use. Targeting adolescents for assessment and treatment makes good sense toward preventing long-term negative consequences for individuals, families, and communities." Questionnaire co-authors included Ohio State University professor John Gibbs, Seton Hill University alumna Michele Konopisos, '04 and current Seton Hill art therapy graduate student Kristin Barriga. "The project took a few years to come to fruition and the accompanying technical manual was not always fun to write," Dr. Barriga added. "But the upcoming release feels very rewarding because it should help teenagers and their families receive better drug assessment and treatment services, and lead more fulfilling lives."

## Art Therapy Professor Appointed to Second Term on National Art Therapy Credentials Board

**Nina Denninger**, ATR-BC, LPC, director of Seton Hill's art therapy program, has recently been appointed to a second two-year term as a member of the Board of Directors of the Art Therapy Credentials Board (ATCB). The American Art Therapy Association (AATA) created the ATCB to be the national credentialing body for art therapy, and its mission is to protect the public by promoting the competent and ethical practice of art therapy. Denninger serves as the board liaison to the ATCB Registration Standards Committee and as the liaison to the Education Committee of the American Art Therapy Association. She has participated in developing and promoting a new clinical supervisor credential that will soon be offered by the ATCB. In addition, Denninger has completed all her coursework for an EdD in Counselor Education and Supervision at Duquesne University and will be completing her doctoral studies with research into the subject of self-supervision.

## Social Sciences Division Chair Active on State and National Associations for Family and Consumer Sciences

**Sr. Victoria Marie Gribshaw**, SC, PhD, Chair of Seton Hill's Social Sciences Division, recently completed a two-year term on the board of directors of the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences (AAFCS) and is the immediate past president of the Pennsylvania Association of Family and Consumer Sciences (PAFCS), an organization in which she's been active since 1977. areas: education, business and professions, science and technology, arts, voluntary services, and philanthropy. Listed below, in alphabetical order, are Seton Hill's 2007 Distinguished Alumni Leadership Award recipients.

**Rosanne Caretti Gjostein '57** has lived by Dorothy Height's words: "Without community service, we would not have a strong quality of life. It's important to the person who serves as well as the recipient. It's the way in which we ourselves grow and develop." After earning her Bachelor of Arts in Education at Seton Hill, Rosanne devoted much of her life to community service. As her two children grew, so did Rosanne's volunteer involvement in their activities, and in her work with the Children's Hospital of Michigan (CHM). Her strong connection with CHM began when she became a member of Tea and Crumpets, a benefit that she later chaired. She also helped to launch the Festival of Trees, now an annual fundraising event for the hospital, and became chair of the event as well as president of the International Festival of Trees. Elected to the Hospital's Board of Trustees, Rosanne serves as Trustee Chair of the Development Committee and is active on the Research and Medical Affairs committees. Other volunteer efforts include chairing the Henry Ford Estate Dinner Dance Committee as well as organizing the annual Ritz Carlton-Dearborn Event and serving as past president of the Women's National Farm and Garden Association. Rosanne is also a member of the Child's Hope Committee and the Volunteer Council and Women's Association of the Dearborn Symphony. The National Society of Fundraising Executives recognized Rosanne by naming her Volunteer of the Year for the University of Michigan - Dearborn. Belfast, Munich, Lucerne, Rome, Venice, Tessaoniki, Guadalajara, Paris, and Florence. The mezzo soprano has also performed as soloist and presented master classes in Shanghai, Beijing and Tianjin during the Kent Camerata's China Tour of 2002. Hyatt studied voice with Sister Helen Muha and Margaret Garrity at Seton Hill, and with Joyce Zastrow at Western Michigan University. She is also a graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music with formal training under Max Rudolf, Dino Yannopoulos, Giulio Gari, and Maria Callas. Hyatt held the title and rank of Professor at Kent State University and served her last two years as Interim Director of the Hugh A. Glauser School of Music. She has been recognized for her "outstanding contributions to international culture" by receiving the Kent State University International Award in the field of International Communication and Cross-Cultural Achievements for teaching and performing. In the course of her career, Hyatt has performed in over twenty operas, including *Madame Butterfly*, *Don Giovanni*, *Carmen*, *Dido and Aeneas*, *Hansel und Gretel*, and *Cavalleria Rusticana*. Her CD releases include: *Song Upon Song* (TimeGrabber, 1997), and *A Musical Painting Comes to Life* (Crystal Records, 2001), where she is a featured soloist. Now retired from Kent State, Mary Sue performs for special occasions as one of a three-member ensemble, Desert Divas, and as a member of the Kent Camerata, an international touring American vocal/instrumental ensemble.

**Sister Vivien Linkhauer, '67**, who is embarking on her second five-year term as the Provincial Superior and President of the United States Province of the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill, has also had a distinguished career as a Professor of French and an administrator at Seton Hill University. Following her graduation from Seton Hill with a Bachelor of Arts degree in French, Sister Vivien received her master's and doctoral degrees in French from Tufts University.

Her responsibilities included the supervision of the formation program of the Congregation, the oversight of the History Project, and the liaison with the Korean Region of the Congregation, as well as service as Secretary in the Leadership Conference of Women Religious, Region IV, and the Tri-Diocesan Sisters Leadership Conference. A member of the Mercy Jeannette Hospital Board of Trustees, the Pittsburgh Mercy Health System Board of Directors, Catholic Health East's Sponsor Board, the Seton Hill University Board of Trustees, the Board of the DePaul School for Hearing and Speech, the Board of Elizabeth Seton Center, and the Board of St. Anne Home, Sister Vivien pursues her interests in the French School of Spirituality and the Advisory Committee of the Elizabeth Ann Seton Writing Project.

**Anita Lavin Manoli '52**, retired teacher of Spanish, is a role model for energetic community service. She has generously shared her time, talent, and resources with many local organizations, including Seton Hill University, where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish. Anita, who began her education in 1948 with the Class of 1952, took a hiatus that included positions at KDKA in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and Kennametal in

Latrobe, Pennsylvania, marriage, and the birth of four of her five children. She returned to Seton Hill and received her degree in 1968, 20 years after she began. After working as a social worker for one year, she accepted a position teaching Spanish for the Derry Area School District. In addition, Anita taught Spanish at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, and Westmoreland County Community College in Youngwood, Pennsylvania, in the evenings and during the summers while pursuing her MA in Hispanic Languages and Literature from the University of Pittsburgh, which she earned in 1977. She retired from her position in Derry as Spanish teacher and Chair of Foreign Languages in 1993 and completed her teaching career following an appointment as an adjunct professor of Spanish at Seton Hill. At this point in her life, Anita directed her energies toward her volunteer efforts. A docent at the Westmoreland Museum of Art in Greensburg, Pennsylvania, she is also a member of the Museum's Women's Committee and a volunteer in the gift shop. She serves on the Westmoreland Symphony Orchestra's Hat Luncheon Committee and Annual Fund Campaign and is an interpreter in Spanish and Italian for the Latrobe Area Hospital. Chair of the Latrobe Industrial Development Authority, Anita is also a member and past president of the Latrobe Civic Club, and a member of the Westmoreland County Democratic Committee. For her alma mater she has been a phonathon participant, a capital campaign volunteer, and, with her husband, Charles, created the Anita Lavin Manoli '52 Endowment Scholarship Fund. She is also a member of the Seton Hill University Heritage Society. In recognition of her volunteer work, Anita received the Westmoreland Museum of Art Volunteer of the Year Award and was the recipient of the Great Teacher Award at Saint Vincent College. She is a member of Alpha Mu Gamma, National Honorary Foreign Language Fraternity and Pi Mu Gamma, National Honorary Social Studies Fraternity.

**Cheryl Maurana '72**, senior associate dean and professor, Medical College of Wisconsin, earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology from Seton Hill.

Maurana is the first woman to be appointed senior associate dean for Public and Community Health, and is one of three women to serve on the thirty-member Executive Committee for the Medical College of Wisconsin. After completing her PhD in Health Services Research, Sociology from Purdue University, Cheryl completed a four-year U.S. Public Health Services Fellowship in health services research and joined the faculty at Purdue, where she directed the Social Research Institute. She was then appointed associate dean for Community Health at Wright State University School of Medicine, where she founded the University's Center for Healthy Communities, which has been selected one of twenty national models by the U.S. Public Health Service's Health Resources and Services Administration. When Cheryl joined the Medical College of Wisconsin, she founded the College's Center for Healthy Communities. Cheryl provides leadership for implementing the college's vision for public and community health, and has provided leadership for the College's partnerships with over 300 statewide organizations to promote a healthier public. She has created a new Center for Science, Health, and Society and has been a key leader in the creation of Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin. Under Cheryl's leadership as professor of Population Health, the College recently received the Association of American Medical Colleges National Award for Outstanding Community Service. Cheryl has headed the development of a new doctoral degree in public and community health, the first of its kind in Wisconsin and one of two in the nation. Cheryl's awards are numerous and include the President's Award for Excellence for Outstanding Collaboration, the School of Medicine Award for Excellence in Medical Education (both from Wright State), the Community-Campus Partnerships for Health Leadership

Award, and the Association Partnership of the Year Award, Medical College of Wisconsin.

**Barbara McDermott '77**, prominent criminal defense attorney in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, has chosen her field of law due to her belief that all members of society benefit when the least powerful are treated fairly and compassionately. She believes that the criminal justice system prosecutes the guilty party far more often than it sends an innocent person to jail, and strives as a defense attorney to limit any miscarriages of justice. She has focused on capital cases because of her belief in the sanctity of all human life, and prides herself on the fact that none of her clients has ever received the death penalty. Barbara graduated from Seton Hill with a Bachelor of Arts degree and continued her education at Georgetown University's Law Center. She began her law career with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. After working as a Special Deputy Attorney General to prosecute violators of the Commonwealth's hazardous waste law, she joined the Philadelphia District Attorney's Office, where she spent six years prosecuting thousands of felony cases and numerous homicides. Following 10 years of clerkships with two different judges of the Court of Common Pleas, Barbara began her criminal defense work, which she continues today. Eager to share her knowledge of the legal system, she mentors young attorneys, works with the National Institute of Trial Advocacy in teaching trial skills to law students, and lectures at Widener School of Law's Intensive Trial Advocacy Program while providing legal services for community organizations such as the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Rape. Very active in her community, Barbara serves as the president of the Prisoner's Family Welfare Association, an organization that provides short term financial relief for families of individuals incarcerated in the Philadelphia prison system; represents



her parish, St. Vincent DePaul, on the Urban Resource Development Corporation, whose mission it is to improve and stabilize the neighborhoods of northwest Philadelphia; and is a member of the Neighborhood Interfaith Movement's Congregation and Community Council. She has also served on the Seton Hill University Alumni Corporation Board.

**Mary Anne Spellman McGrath '59**, generous benefactor to Seton Hill along with her husband Jack, received a scholarship through the Sisters of Charity that enabled her to attend Seton Hill, from which she graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish. A graduate of Sacred Heart High School in Pittsburgh, which was staffed by the Sisters of Charity, she was ever mindful of her gratitude for the grant "that made all the difference in the world for me." Mary Anne taught in a junior high school in Oxon Hill, Maryland. Her subsequent marriage to Jack spanned four decades and was blessed with two daughters and a son. Diagnosed with multiple sclerosis at age 30, Mary Anne bravely battled the affliction for 40 years. Recently, Mary Anne and Jack established an endowed scholarship for Seton Hill University, a gift to provide opportunity to students with potential greater than

resources. The gift was made with Mary Anne's characteristic humility, grace, and gratitude: "I am happy to give back." On March 20, 2007, just days after she was selected to receive Seton Hill's Distinguished Alumni Leadership Award, Mary Anne lost her valiant battle to the illness that cast a

shadow over her life for so many years. Her spirit and generosity will live on at Seton Hill and in the lives of the young men and women who are given a chance to excel, thanks to her kindness. Mary Anne's husband, Jack, and daughter, Meghan McIntyre, accepted her award.

**Patricia Mullen '57**, has combined her scientific knowledge and her entrepreneurial skills to establish a successful soap manufacturing company, Lenco Soap Company, in Warren, Rhode Island. Pat received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Chemistry from Seton Hill, and, following a brief stint in the workforce where she assisted in developing a copying system for Charles

Bruning Company, Pat received a graduate scholarship to Mt. Holyoke College and earned an MA in Chemistry. She then joined American Cyanamid, where she applied her graduate experience in vacuum ultraviolet spectroscopy to become a member of a team headed by Dr. Robert Hirt, one of the leading spectroscopists in the country. The team researched the development of protective tiles for spacecraft and produced artificial light sticks for the US Navy. Other responsibilities at American Cyanamid, which included research on ultraviolet absorbers and reflective coatings, preceded Pat's selection to work on a project for Lederle Laboratories that involved the production of tetracycline. A transfer to American Cyanamid's Breck and Shulton division provided Pat with experience as a group leader in Hair Care, where she remained until her move to Naarden International as manager of the Fragrance Applications Laboratory. Following the sale of Naarden, Pat founded Lenco Soap. Author of several publications on the structure of various organic compounds, and the owner of several patents, Pat's avocation has been showing dogs in obedience training. Despite some health problems, she has forged ahead in her gym training and has won medals in Senior Olympics shot put, discus, and

javelin events. An official resident of Columbia, Tennessee, Pat commutes to Warren, Rhode Island to lead her business.

**Cheryl Napsha '77**, an innovative librarian who has been recognized for her unique library programming, took a circuitous route to reach her career goal. An English major at

Seton Hill, from which she graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree, Napsha earned her Master of Library Science from the University of Pittsburgh. Cheryl served as assistant to the University librarian and head of the library's business office while at the University of Illinois in Chicago. During her nine-year tenure at the Adams Memorial Library in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, she doubled the circulation, tripled the collection size, increased the size of the staff from 7 to 28, and launched new programs, including one that attracted attention from the *Wall Street Journal*: a non-traditional full-service library branch located inside a supermarket. During this period she became a fellow in the Snowbird Institute, an international program for emerging library leaders, and in the

Pennsylvania Rural Leadership Program. Directorships at the Williams Library in Ohio and at Sewickley Academy in Pittsburgh, her alma mater, preceded her appointment as director of the Bethel Park Library. In addition to managing a major renovation there, she launched more innovative programs, including one in which caregivers and infants visit a local nursing home for story time. In 2006, the library began volunteering services and time to the Homeless Children's Educational Fund. With the help of a state grant, resource libraries were established in all 18 homeless shelters in Allegheny County. In May 2007, Cheryl relocated to Westland, Michigan, where she accepted the directorship of the William G. Faust Public Library.

When **Irene O'Brien Nunn '67**, recognized portrait artist and art teacher, graduated from Seton Hill with a Bachelor of Arts in Art/Studio Arts, she knew that art would be the centerpiece of her life. Her career began as an art teacher in the Philadelphia Public Schools where her students received city and state awards, the highlight of which was their Salute to the States exhibit during the Bicentennial Celebration. Featured at First Continental Bank in Philadelphia, the 50 panel montage represented the economic and cultural contributions of all 50 states. At this time Irene also began to accept commissioned portrait work. Following her marriage to Wally Nunn and the adoption of their daughter, Irene left teaching and became a full-time mother and volunteer. Her interest in adoption led her to a position on the board of the National Adoption Center, where she served on committees, planned major fundraisers, and coordinated arts and crafts projects. After being elected to the Upper Darby School Board, Irene, with her husband, initiated a Sponsor a Scholar Program that matched qualified students with area employers who provided financial and educational support for their aspirations. Irene also worked with the National Forum Foundation to coordinate programs in the Philadelphia area that brought together opposing social critics and journalists for panel discussions on welfare, education, and foreign policy. Her interest in art undiminished, Irene returned to teaching at her daughter's school while continuing her commissioned portrait and landscape work and conducting workshops from her studio in the Manayunk section of Philadelphia. Her awards and recognitions include The Neuman Saunders Award for Excellence, The Delaware County Community College Annual Exhibit, and the American College Summer Juried Exhibit.

# SHU ALUMNUS RICK AUSTIN '07 DRAFTED BY PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES

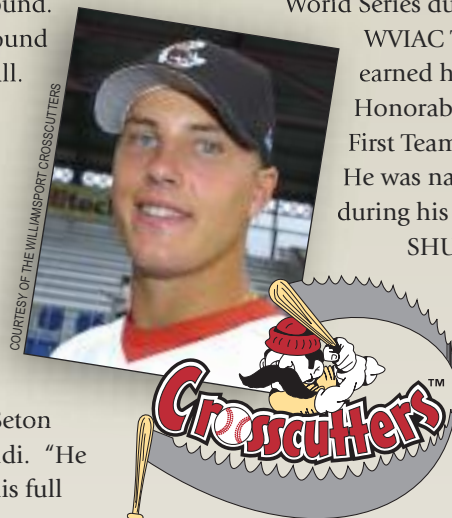
**S**eton Hill University right handed pitcher Rick Austin became the first Griffin baseball player to be drafted in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft on June 8, 2007 when he was drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies in the 27th round. He was the 19th pick in the 27th round and the 833rd pick of the draft overall. Austin had just graduated from Seton Hill on May 12 with a BS in computer science.

Austin's climb to professional baseball has been an interesting one, considering he did not play high school baseball until his senior year.


"Rick made tremendous strides both as a pitcher and a person during his time here at Seton Hill," says head baseball coach Marc Marizzaldi. "He dedicated himself from day one to reaching his full potential, and he has certainly earned this awesome opportunity to continue his baseball career. With his work ethic, the sky is the limit..."

This is a terrific event for our baseball program, and really reflects how far we've come."

Austin's Seton Hill career was highlighted by a trip to the NAIA World Series during his junior season. Named an All WVIAC Team Honorable Mention in 2007, Austin earned honors in 2006 as an NAIA All-American Honorable Mention, and as an All-NAIA Region IX First Team and All-AMC North First Team selection. He was named to the Second Team All-AMC North during his sophomore season. Over his four years at SHU, Austin, a native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, had a 22-18 record with a 4.00 ERA. He threw 256.1 innings, giving up 165 runs on 239 hits, while striking out 238 and walking 116. Austin holds the Seton Hill single season record for ERA with a 2.31 ERA during his senior season. He also holds the Seton Hill career record for strikeouts with 238.

# Financial HIGHLIGHTS

During 2006-2007, Seton Hill University continued to strengthen its financial position. The effort is increasingly important as we strive to provide a distinctive and challenging academic experience for students. Here are some highlights:

- Seton Hill University ended its fiscal year with a \$1,462,489 operating surplus making this the ninth consecutive year of operating surpluses.
- Total assets increased by \$9.4 million or 16%.
- The Endowment increased by \$2.3 million or 19%.
- Since Capital Campaign fund raising began in 1998, Seton Hill has achieved over \$66 million in gifts and pledges.
- Alumni, friends, foundations and corporations continue to strengthen Seton Hill through participation in the Annual Fund. Gifts to the Fund in 2006-2007 totaled \$1,804,847.
- New academic and athletic programs, improved campus facilities, and the University Center for the Performing Arts in the City of Greensburg project are generating enrollment growth and transforming our campus and our region.

Through the continued generosity of our donors, Seton Hill University will be prepared to meet the demands currently facing institutions of higher learning. Seton Hill is grateful for your commitment and support and will remain a thoughtful steward of the personal and financial resources you share.

# IRA LEGISLATION

## ALLOWS TAX FREE CHARITABLE GIVING

### CHARITABLE IRA ROLLOVER EXPIRES DECEMBER 31

Making a lasting mark through your support of Seton Hill University is a wonderful thing. Having the chance to see the immediate impact of your legacy is even better.

If you are 70 ½ or older, a provision of the Pension Protection Act allows you to make cash gifts totaling up to \$100,000 a year from your traditional or Roth IRA to Seton Hill without incurring income tax on the withdrawal.

This is good news for alumni and friends who want to make a charitable gift during their lifetime from their retirement assets, but have been discouraged from doing so because of the income tax penalty. The provision is effective for the 2007 tax year only. Donors must act by **December 31** to take advantage of this opportunity.

### MAKING A GIFT TO SETON HILL THROUGH YOUR IRA

If you are considering a gift, please consult your attorney or financial advisor to confirm your eligibility and learn how to initiate the transfer:

- Instruct your financial advisor or plan administrator to make a “qualified charitable distribution” or “charitable IRA rollover” and to transfer a specific amount directly to Seton Hill University.
- The distribution may be made by check or direct cash wire with your name included on the check or wiring documents. Compliance with the Pension Protection Act requires that the check or distribution proceeds come to Seton Hill directly.
- Gifts made to Seton Hill through the Pension Protection Act can be designated for a specific purpose, used to create an endowed scholarship, or build an existing scholarship.
- Gifts made to Seton Hill through the Pension Protection Act may be used to fulfill pledges.

### WHY NOW?

Whatever your investment objectives, the Pension Protection Act can help you realize your Seton Hill legacy and make an impact more significant than you ever thought possible. But time is running out. Congress has specified that the provision is in effect through December 31, 2007. It expires on January 1, 2008.

## AN EXAMPLE OF HOW THE CHARITABLE IRA ROLLOVER WORKS

Mary, age 74, received a generous scholarship to attend Seton Hill and she would like to help current Seton Hill students in the same way. Mary is a member of The Heritage Society and has included a provision in her will to leave \$50,000 to the University to establish an endowed scholarship fund in her name. The Pension Protection Act allows Mary to roll over \$50,000 from her IRA this year—and establish the scholarship and see it at work—during her lifetime.
